

How to USE your Stick With It®

- 1** Open the case, peel off the protective plastic film from each side and set aside for later use. (*You will use one in STEP 5, and have an extra one for future use*).
- 2** Gather all of your favorite refills or depotted make-up pans that you'd like to put in your palette. Items that cling best are smooth and clean. Make sure the underside is clean and dry - free of powder, lotions, oils, and glue. Use rubbing alcohol to remove any surface stuff.
- 3** Set your make-up pans where you want them on the unique surface. To reposition, gently pry the edge of the pan with the handle of a tweezers. The pans will lift right off with little effort.
- 4** Once you have it organized the way you like it, gently press the edge of each item to secure in place.
- 5** Lay the plastic film on top of the make-up to reduce the transfer of powder when the case is closed. Prior models came with vellum paper for this purpose.



If your make-up doesn't stick...

A quick easy fix is to cover the pan with a round, **self-adhesive, permanent, glossy sticker**. This serves as a clean contact area for your make-up to stick.

Note: Be mindful of placing items that sit up higher. There may not be enough room to place make-up on the adjacent lid preventing you from closing the case.

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How to CLEAN your Stick With It®

- 1** Option 1: Anti-bacterial Towelettes
Remove all products from the surface. Then wipe the bottom of your make-up pans and the palette surface clean with anti-bacterial towelettes and let fully dry. To spot clean, use a towelette with your fingertip.
 - 2** Option 2: Rubbing Alcohol and Flat Cotton Rounds
Remove all products from the surface. Then wipe the bottom of your make-up pans and the palette surface clean with rubbing alcohol and a flat cotton round - let fully dry.
- *Please avoid using baby wipes.** They will not clean the palette - they contain lotions and leave fibers behind. If you have used a lotion-based brand, use rubbing alcohol to clean and prep the surface.



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
